Dear Parents of Middle School Students (or incoming Middle School Students),

The end of the school year has finally arrived! At this time of year, we begin to plan for the fall and our expectations for student work over the summer. All students entering Middle School should know the **Sign of the Cross**, **Our Father**, *Hail Mary*, *Glory Be*, *Morning Offering*, **Grace before and After a Meal**, *Apostle's Creed and Act of Contrition*. Students will be given graded activities during the first weeks of school to assess their knowledge of these basic Catholic prayers of our faith.

Throughout the year, they will also be assessed on their knowledge of other Catholic Basics: **The Divine Mercy Chaplet, Anima Christi, the Prayer before the Crucifix, The Seven Sacraments, The Precepts of the Church, Virtues, The Beatitudes, The Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy, the Rosary and the Stations of the Cross.** Please see the attached review materials which will provide assistance with these basic Catholic prayers. Students and families are also encouraged to attend Sunday Mass.

All Middle School students will need a Catholic Bible at home to use as reference for homework assignments throughout the school. If your household does not have a Catholic Bible, here are some recommendations (Please note the last four on the list are geared towards teenagers):


The Catholic Bible **can also be accessed via the USCCB website** (https://bible.usccb.org/bible). However, your child will need internet access and a device to utilize this format.

Leader: Behold the handmaid of the Lord All: Be it done unto me according to Thy word. Hail Mary...


Leader: And the Word was made Flesh, All: And dwelt among us. Hail Mary...

In the Name of the Father, (right hand on forehead)


and of the Son, (right hand on chest)


APOSTLES CREED



PRECEPTS OF THE CHURCH

- 1. Celebrate Christ's resurrection every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation by taking part in
- Mass and avoiding unnecessary work. 2. Lead a sacramental life. Receive Holy Communion frequently and the Sacrament of Reconciliation or Penance regularly. We must receive Holy Communion at least once a year at Lent/Easter time. If we have committed serious, or mortal, sin we must confess within a year and before receiving Holy Communion again.
- 3. Study Catholic teaching throughout one's life, especially in preparing for the sacraments.
- 4. Observe the marriage laws of the Catholic Church and give religious training to one's children.
- 5. Strengthen and support the Church: one's own parish, the diocese, the worldwide Church and the Holy Father.
- 6. Do penance, including not eating meat and fasting from food on certain days of fast and abstinence.
- 7. Join in the missionary spirit and work of the Church.

- 2. Then on the Our Father Beads say the following:

Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

3. On the 10 Hail Mary Beads say the following:

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

- 4. Repeat step 2 and 3 for all five decades.
- 5. Conclude with (three times): Holy God, Holy Mighty One,

Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.
